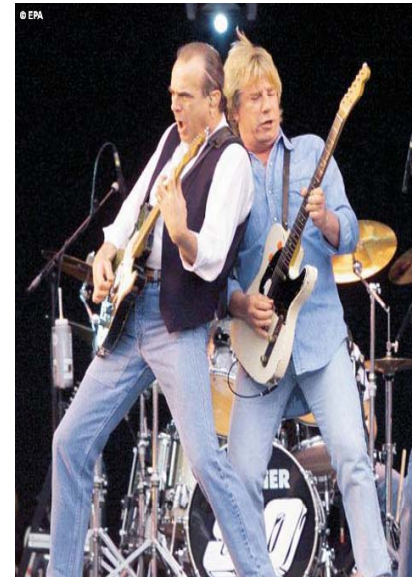

# Some things don't change

- Medicines wastage £150 million.
- 30–50% of medicines are not being taken as intended.
- Patients receive insufficient information about medicines.
- Preventable adverse effects of medicines account for 4–5% of hospital admissions.
- Unacceptable levels of medication associated errors in care homes.
- Unacceptable levels of use of antipsychotics in dementia.
- GMC study demonstrated an unacceptable level of prescribing error by hospital doctors.
- Variation in the use of some medicines across different areas of England.
